## **SWAP Needs Your Help Now**

The California Transportation Commission (CTC) has until June 30th to encumber SWAPs \$500,000 CalTrans grant. When we applied for our grant, we had anticipated a 1992 ballot initiative for an environmental bond act that would have provided \$1.2 million toward the purchase of the Elfin Forest. That didn't happen. The CTC has stipulated that final award of our grant is dependent upon our finding other sources of matching funds -- and that we do so by the June 2nd meeting of the CTC.

#### What are we doing about it?

We anticipate \$200,000 from the state Coastal Conservancy (pending approval by their board). We expect some support from the state Wildlife Conservation Board and the State Lands Commission. And we have set our sights on raising at least \$100,000 from within San Luis Obispo County.

#### What will that get us?

The asking price of \$3 million was based on a 1988 appraisal placing a value of \$3.8 million on the property. We are in process of having a new appraisal made with the cooperation of the property owner and following the state guidelines for real estate appraisals. We do not expect to be able to raise enough money to purchase the entire parcel by June. We do expect to be able to purchase a percentage of the property (based on the new appraisal) plus an option to complete the purchase within a reasonable period of time.

Where does the rest of the money come from? We have several proposals in the works -- unfortunately, none would provide funds before the June cut-off date. But these funds will help to complete the purchase.

Can you give a little to help save a lot? We need your help now.




# Swing Into Spring on Saturday March 20th.
